Arcanum String Quartet

The Arcanum String Quartet started at Stony Brook University during fall 2014. The Quartet is composed of members from East Carolina University. The Arcanum String Quartet is coached by violinist/pedagogue Hagai Shaham and the Emerson String Quartet. The Arcanum String Quartet is pushing the boundaries of technology by using it to create a new way of experiencing chamber music. Through the use of LIVE streaming the quartet allows audience members to talk with the quartet directly and see how they rehearse. Together with the quartet, the audience can explore the chamber repertoire in depth.

Cliff Baldwin and ACME

Cliff Baldwin is a sculptor, composer and filmmaker. He lives and works in Aquebogue, New York. He has exhibited in Tokyo, Cologne, Berlin, Mexico City, Los Angeles, and New York. His work is in numerous collections including MoMA, The Walker Art Center, The Museum of The Art Institute of Chicago, The National Gallery of Canada and The Museum of Rhode Island School of Design. He has done public sculpture in New York, Mexico City, Stockholm and Warsaw since 1989. He has collaborated on video operas at the Kitchen, Galapagos and Knitting Factory with composer Mikel Rouse and performed The Language of Light at the Parrish Art Museum in 2015. His most recent music, Chiang My Days is available on Bandcamp and iTunes. Cliff Baldwin is the founder of the Aquebogue Contemporary Music Ensemble – ACME.

Paolo Bartolani, pianist

Paolo Bartolani is a pianist, musicologist and music manager in classical and contemporary music. He graduates in 1989 at the S. Cecilia Music Conservatory in Rome (Italy) with Eduardo Hubert. He perfects his studies with Charles Rosen, György Sándor and Andor Foldes. He studied French piano repertoire with Germaine Mounier at the Ecole Normale de Musique in Paris and in 1994 he obtains his Master in Musicology of the 20th century under the direction of Hugues Dufourt at the Ecole des Hautes Etudes en Sciences Sociales in collaboration with IRCAM / Centre G. Pompidou in Paris.

Paolo is a soloist and performs with chamber ensembles in Europe and United States. Paolo Bartolani is at the Venice Biennale from 2008 to 2012 as General Coordinator of ENPARTS - European Network of Performing Arts to promote the creation of new works in dance, music and theater and the mobility of young artists throughout Europe. Currently Paolo Bartolani is the General Coordinator of Music Up Close Network at Santa Cecilia National Academy in Rome (Italy). This is an Network involving seven European Orchestras to promote new orchestral works and support a new generation of talented musicians to connect with young audiences. He is also the Artistic & Executive Director of Rites of Spring Music Fest to promote classical and contemporary music on the East End of Long Island.

Masha Carrera, Soprano

Masha Carrera has studied in Rome at the Santa Cecilia Music Conservatory. She perfected the Mozartian repertory with Rudolf Knoll at the Mozarteum in Salzburg, the donizettian repertory with Paolo Montarsolo and the Italian lyrical repertory with Renata Scotto at the Santa Cecilia National Academy. She won the International Competition XXV Toti Dal Monte and was engaged to sing La Sonnanbula in the Theatres of Treviso and Rovigo. The career of Masha Carrera, before exploding with the interpretation of Violetta and Lucia, has drawn her to Cologne for Klassik Komm Festival (Carmina Burana), in Bologna, Paris (Festival d'Hiver), London at the Holland Park Festival Production in Gianni Schicchi (Lauretta), New York, San Francisco, on tour in San Jose and Frankfurt Alte Opern, just to say a few. Other debuts are then arrived in Don Pasquale (Norina), Elisr d'Amore (Adina) in Rigoletto directed by Piero Bellugi.

She has to her credit numerous recital of sacred music and symphonic as well. After a successful tour in Japan, with the debut in the role of Violetta in "La Traviata" by Verdi, she has received numerous invitations to bring his interpretations in Theatres across Europe; Richard Bonynge himself has willed at his side in the theater Megaron Athens to sing her "unique" Violetta. She was also the Matilde in the M.W. Chung production of Rossini's "Guillaume Tell".

Brian Smith, percussionist

Percussionist Brian Smith is a versatile performer and an experienced educator. He has performed with orchestras throughout the United States and Europe, playing in some of the world's most renowned concert halls including the Amsterdam Concertgebouw and the Berlin Philharmonie. He is a two-time winner of the second prize at the MTNA national solo percussion competition and has recorded for the Naxos label.

In addition to his role as principal percussionist with the Orchestra of the Southern Finger Lakes, Brian performs as the timpanist with the Endless Mountain Music Festival and as a chamber music artist with the Staunton Music Festival. His strong interest in performing new works and collaborating with composers has led to the premier of several new works. Current projects include audio-visual performances that explore animated musical notation and live foley artistry.

Appreciated by critics and the general public for the incredible artistic talent and for the highly expressive and communicative power of his interpretations, the pianist Niccolo Ronchi boasts many international awards. He will present a virtuoso classic piano program with Paganini Variations by Brahms and Totentanz by Liszt.

In November 2006, he won the "International Chopin Piano Competition" in Rome and is the start of a concert career that led him to play in some of the halls and the most prestigious theaters ("Teatro la Fenice" Venice, "Auditorium Parco della Musica" in Rome, "Aula Magna of Sapienza" in Rome).

lan David Rosenbaum, percussionist

Praised for his "excellent" and "precisely attuned" performances by the New York Times, percussionist Ian David Rosenbaum has developed a musical breadth far beyond his years. He made his Kennedy Center debut in 2009 and later that year garnered a special prize created for him at the Salzburg International Marimba Competition. Mr. Rosenbaum joined the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center's CMS Two program in 2012 as only the second percussionist they have selected in their history. He has appeared at the Bay Chamber, Bridgehampton, Chamber Music Northwest, Music@Menlo, Norfolk, and Yellow Barn festivals.

Mr. Rosenbaum is a member of Sandbox Percussion, HOWL, the Pittsburgh New Music Ensemble, Novus NY, Time Travelers and Le Train Bleu. He has recorded for the Bridge, Innova, Naxos, and Starkland labels and is on the faculty of the Dwight School in Manhattan. Mr. Rosenbaum endorses Vic Firth sticks and mallets.









